From the Pastor,

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

The Easter season, which, I remind us, continues through April and May!, has not (yet) brought with it the natural warmth, color, and sunniness that we — or that I, at least, thinking of California — might have desired. Perhaps Punxsutawney Phil had something to do with that.

In any case, it reminds us that, just as the association between Christmas and (in the Northern Hemisphere) winter is pretty much accidental and arbitrary, so the connection between Easter and (again, in the Northern Hemisphere) springtime — no matter how that connection may be enforced by greeting cards and department store displays — is not part of the Biblical and Christian meaning of Easter.

At this point I would be tempted to go off on a rant about how the Easter holiday has in our culture been completely drained of all of its Biblical and Christian meaning, to a degree that leaves even Christmas behind. (A completely representative example of the standard attitude, plucked at random from online: “While you were spending time with family over the weekend, enjoying the start of the baseball season or watching college basketball....”) But that would be a waste of energy.

What strikes me, instead, is that, although Easter — precisely as carrying its full Biblical and Christian meaning — is part of a cycle of celebration that happens every year; and, indeed, although Easter — as insisted on by many Christian traditions — is really celebrated in some way every Sunday, with the people of God confessing “Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again”; even so, Easter is not about repetition.

Easter is not about the springtime "rebirth" of life from hibernation and frozenness — as lovely as that is. Easter has nothing to do with the "possibilities" that emerge for us human beings after a weary time of waiting — however amazing those might be. Easter doesn't "happen" over and over again as people, or the church, move forward with a new burst of energy — even if that kind of thing is much to be desired and prayed for.

Easter happened, once, when Jesus rose from the dead — and he will not ever rise again, because he cannot ever die again. Moreover, his rising from the dead was the proof, not of the possibility of rebirth or of the potential that life has within itself, but of the completion and fulfillment — including our own resurrection — that God has promised to give as a gift to everything he created.

What we celebrate when we celebrate Easter, every year, with all the energy and joy that the Holy Spirit in mercy grants to us, are the power of God and the love of God shown in this one historical event: power and love which indeed touch, challenge, and transform, from the "outside," every time, every occasion, every life, everywhere in the universe.

Easter happened, once, and that once changed everything. The cycles and years we've been given to know that, and to give thanks for that, are a sign of God's patience and kindness toward us, so that we, and every creature, may learn to worship and obey him, always.

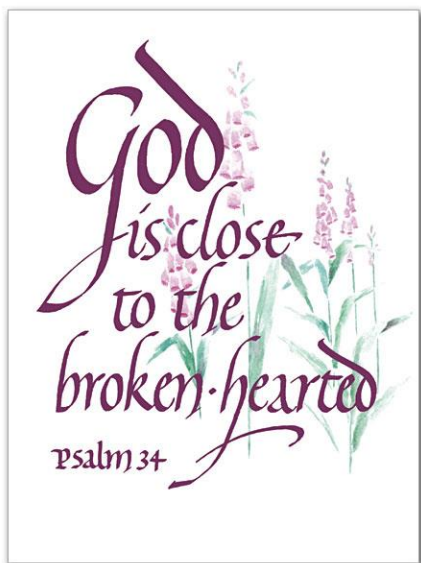

The Blessing of Unexpected Generosity

Dear Friends,

"Let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven" (Matthew 5:16).

Thank you for how you exemplify this verse through your generosity. My wife, Lois, and I were blessed to be recipients of the good deeds of others on our recent trip to the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) and The Gambia, where we visited WMPL workers and a partner church, and explored a possible new one (The Gambia). We praise our Father in heaven as a result. The truth in that verse is for believers and unbelievers.

During our visit to DRC, we received word that Lois' father passed away. We knew it was coming, but it still caught us off-guard. As we traveled to a couple of partner churches the next day, the Bishop blessed us by leading each church in a time of silence and a beautiful song as they grieved with us. A moving, unexpected, and generous act of kindness and compassion that truly blessed us.

This morning, my daughter, who's on a road trip from Washington DC to Kansas City with our four grandchildren between the ages of one and six, texted us that she had stopped at a Chic-Fil-A in West Virginia yesterday and that they served her for free. I asked how that came about, and she wrote back, *"Frazzled mom with four little kids all needing the bathroom is what did it, I think. On the receipt, it said, 'intentional kindness payment.' I was so frazzled it took me a few minutes to realize I hadn't even paid..."* She said that the manager walked over and sat near them and told them about his seven children and his farm..."

Tears welled in my eyes as I thought about how that unexpected good deed, and act of generosity, was given to my courageous (and frazzled) daughter, who wrote how encouraged she was by it. I thank God for this generous manager, and give glory to God in heaven for his faithfulness. I also commit to go about my work looking for others who need an encouraging word, or an act of kindness or generosity, so others will glorify him. I will also 'count my blessings' to keep my eyes on the giver of those blessings.

Thank you for your acts of generosity and kindness that bless the heart of God and result in people glorifying God because of it.

to transform the world

We took 24 Penn State Abington CCO (Coalition for Christian Outreach) students on a retreat March 22 - 23. Holy Trinity provided two containers of pulled pork, two large bags of candy, and plenty of homemade cookies and muffins, while another church provided other needed food.

The retreat was awesome! Thank you for your donations. God moved in mighty ways. Friday night we spent an hour in worship, and students were very much drawn into it. Then I read scriptures about Jesus seeing and noticing people and pointed out that we are all noticed by Christ and we all have a testimony.

We stayed up Friday night playing games until 4:00 AM. The Saturday morning at breakfast, 11 students shared with the group, either telling why they are a Christian or saying they are questioning if they even believe. Then we talked about there being a lot of different testimonies in scripture, and I talked about what Christ has done. I gave them 40 minutes to read through any of the gospels they chose, and students really got into that activity and read many different stories from scripture. Many of them had never read the Bible on their own, so it was cool to see them do that and then ask questions afterward. We spent an hour talking about what the students had read, and together we processed questions about the Bible. It was just amazing!

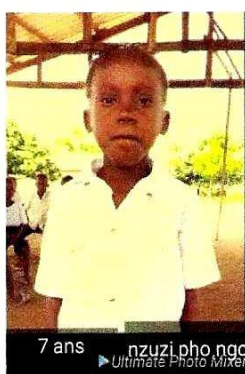
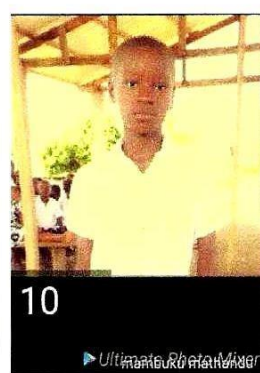
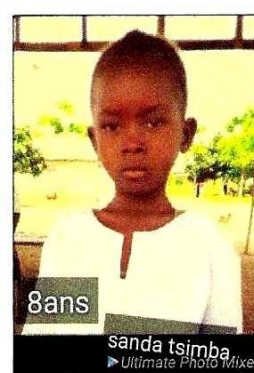
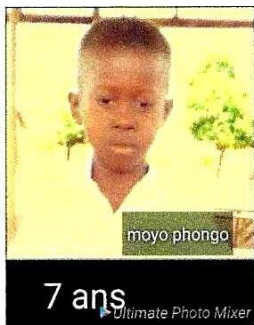
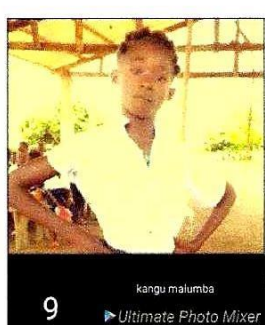
Well on Our Way to Sponsoring Children's Education!

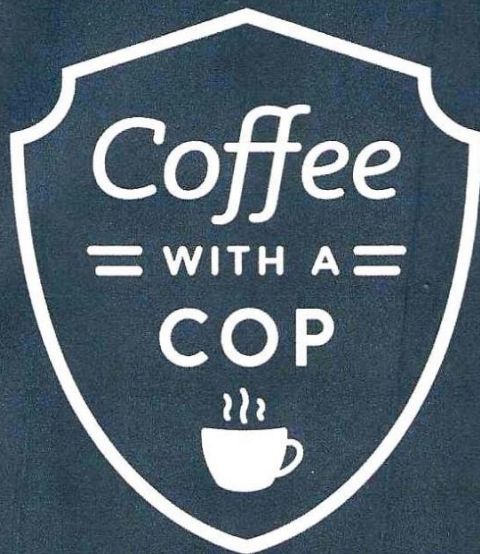
