He was given vinegar to drink, gall to eat — yet he turns water into wine, takes away the taste of bitterness.

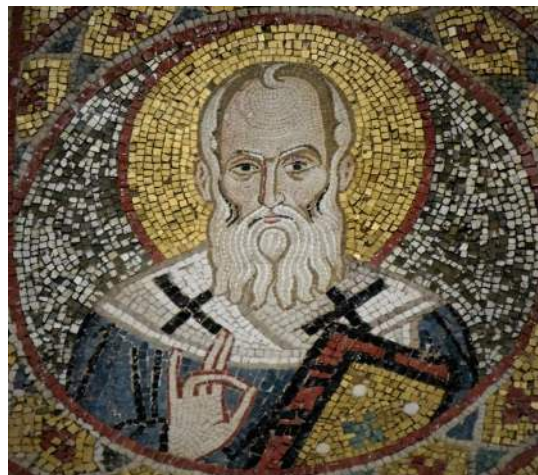
He surrendered his life — yet he has power to take it again, for the veil is rent, things of heaven are revealed, rocks are split, dead men have an early awakening.

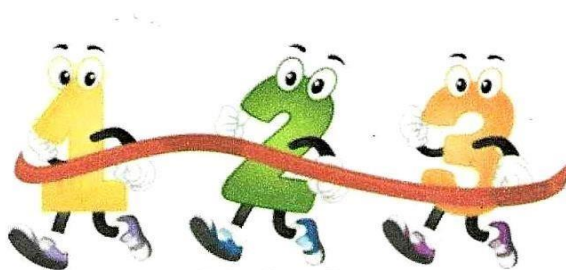
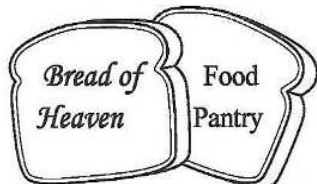

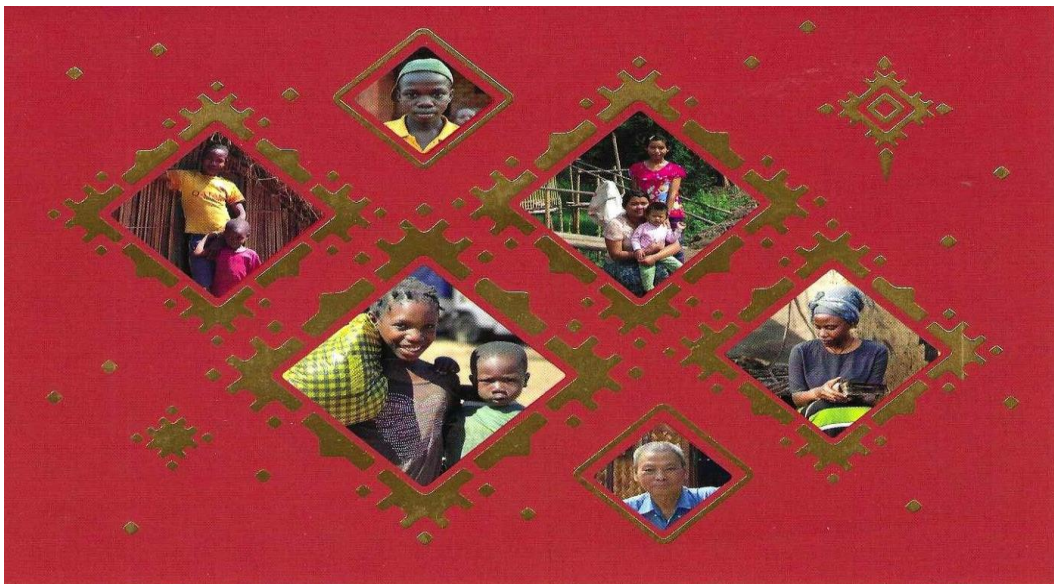

Our mission is to provide individualized care and support to families affected by cancer by addressing their most critical needs so that they can concentrate their efforts on regaining their physical health.

More than 17,000 local families have been impacted by BRF, through financial support, individualized care, and the helping hands of community members like you.

2023 has been our biggest year ever:

- More than 1500 newly referred recipients
- Worked with more than 165 social workers at 96 different facilities
- We are on track to serve 2,121 individuals this year
- We will provide more than 10,000 rides to life-saving cancer treatment by the end of 2023

Thank you for your continued support of the Breathing Room Foundation. I have been a volunteer since it began more than 25 years ago. When my sister Diane and her husband Bernie first started the Breathing Room, it had a real sense of community, of neighbors and friends coming together to care for one another. Today, it's still about the community rallying around individuals fighting cancer who need support, as the teams, students, and neighbors of Diane and Bernie rallied around them 25 years ago.

I deliver primarily comfort bags, snack bags, and financial support envelopes to BRF recipients. The countless doors I have knocked on are most often answered in the same way - with a grateful smile and an invitation into their home. Sometimes it's a quick visit, a thank you for the support, and I'm on my way to the next house. But sometimes I stay longer, meeting the whole family, and learning about who each recipient is as an individual. Sometimes they just need someone to talk to. The conversations cover a wide range of topics - we might talk about Philadelphia sports, the gardening they're doing, and their cancer treatments. Anything and everything.

They all have one thing in common: cancer. And that common denominator is enough for them to need help from the Breathing Room. On top of their cancer diagnosis, they have other, real life problems. Some are lonely. Some are scared. Some are overwhelmed. Some have partners who leave during the cancer treatment because they can't handle it. And many live in poverty.

Ed is the brother of BRF's founder, Diane Fitzgerald and Executive Directive Mary Ellen Fitzgerald. He has spent a lifetime dedicated to serving the public as a US Army veteran and Philadelphia Police Detective. He started a second career as a PA State Parole Board Field Agent and rose through the ranks to become Pennsylvania's District Director in Philadelphia. He has delivered to thousands of BRF recipients as a volunteer.

They have to make the choice between buying medication or paying their rent, between new school shoes for their kids or a ride home from treatment. The Breathing Room's ability to step in and make their burdens a little lighter makes all the difference for many of these people.

For so many of the folks we see, nothing is harder for them than not being able to do something for their kids or grandkids. Getting to help them over that hurdle makes a world of difference. They don't have the energy or time to go out shopping for back to school, or prepare Thanksgiving dinner, or plan and shop for the holidays. Dropping off the beautifully wrapped packages and bags and getting to see the eyes of the kids light up with excitement and the faces of the adults relax with relief and gratitude shows how much offering the helping hand of a neighborhood organization really can mean to people who are having a hard time.

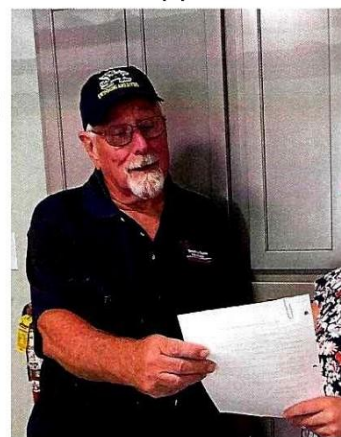

AT THE  SUNDAY, JANUARY 28, 2024

The first item of business will be the adoption of Rules of Procedure.
This adoption of Rules of Procedure has always been done at the outset
of every denominational or synodical convocation (LCA, ELCA, or NALC).

This adoption needs only a simple majority and is done to make the meeting run smoothly. Among other things, The Rules of Procedure say that Holy Trinity's Annual Meeting will be governed by Robert's Rules of Order, that all speeches will be limited to three minutes, and that anyone can present a resolution but that this resolution must be presented in writing to the Committee on Reference and Counsel **by 3:00 p.m.** on the Monday immediately prior the Annual Meeting, **Monday, January 22nd**. At the time each resolution is presented to the Annual Meeting, Reference and Counsel will advise the Annual Meeting as to whether or not the resolution should be adopted.

Rev. Didi Panzo, our missionary in the DRC, recently confirmed that the seminarians pictured on the next page are all continuing their studies and would once again welcome our financial support.

This would not only enable them to pursue their studies without tuition worries, but also provide for the stability of teachers/professors at the Lutheran seminary.

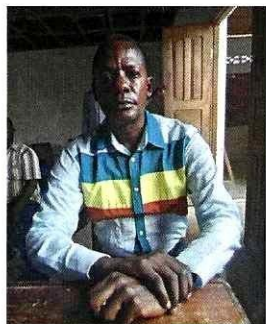


Last year, we also sponsored school children. Pastor Didi has not yet been able to confirm their status with the principal.

Last year, additionally, we provided money to assist Pastor Didi and Seraphina in providing meals for thirty orphans. Sadly, the orphanage was closed due to abuses, and the children were dispersed to different areas. Only a few children remain near Didi and Seraphina at this time.

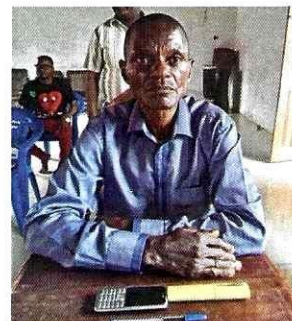

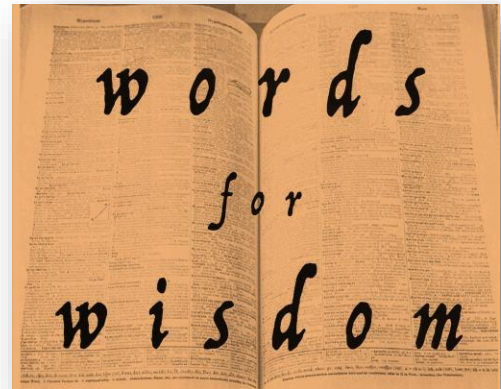

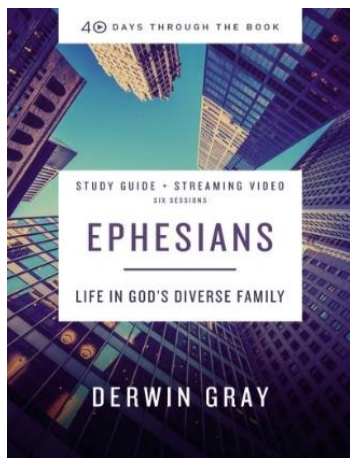
IN THE STUDY:

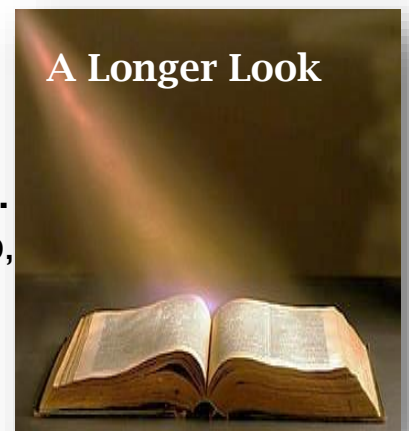
Starting Sunday November 26th
