From the Pastor

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

I'm not a quick or spontaneous writer. To write something — whether it's to remain in that form, like an article, or to be delivered orally, like a sermon — typically takes me considerable time, energy, strain, and frustration. There are times when I think with un-Christian envy about those from whom the written word flows, with ease and brilliance, as if from some mystic, endless fountain. I hear about authors who set themselves specific productivity goals — 5,000 words a day, every day, or whatever — and I can only say: "I can't even begin to imagine how that would work."

The Biblical stories and patterns with which we're familiar — "the word of the Lord came to" such-and-such seer; "at many times and in many ways, God spoke to our fathers by the prophets" (Hebrews 1:1); "he heard a voice saying, 'Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting me?' " (Acts 9:4); "he said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness' " (2 Corinthians 12:9); "no prophecy was ever produced by the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit" (2 Peter 1:21) — sometimes make me wonder why those can't be my experience too.

And yet here's the reality: we *are* — *all* of us — those to whom the word of God comes, from the "outside," by a power and for a purpose that are not our own, allowing us to think differently, giving us a community in which to know a supernatural love, commissioning us to live not for ourselves, encouraging us by a hope which is not of this world. For "in these last days God has spoken to us by his Son, who is the radiance of the glory of God and the exact imprint of his nature" (Hebrews 1:2–3), and it's through the Son that we may "continually offer up a sacrifice of praise to God, the fruit of lips that acknowledge his name" (Hebrews 13:15).

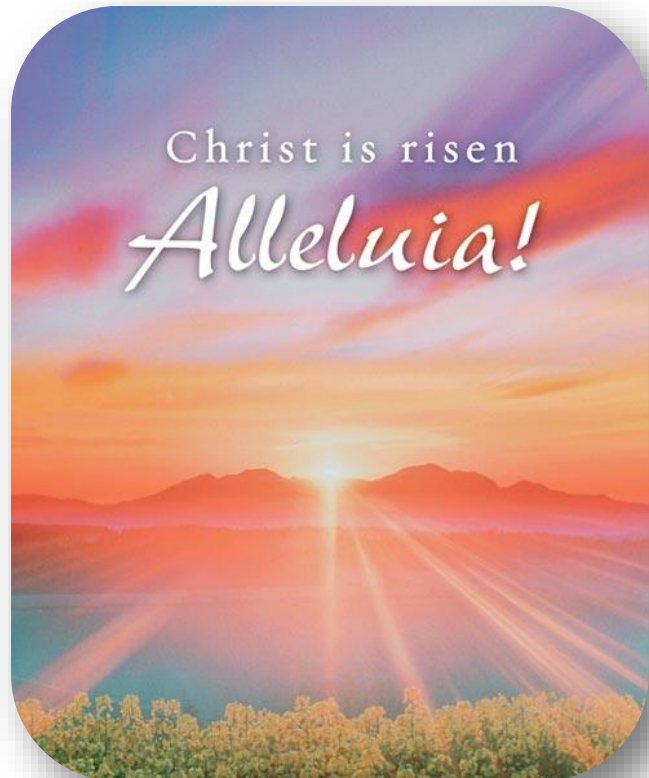

Dear Friends,

Thank you for your generous gift to the work of the World Mission Prayer League!

I began my day today with a Peer 2 Peer Session with directors of several other organizations involved with me in the CEO Onboarding Program offered by MissioNexus. As I facilitated the meeting at the request of our executive coach, I wondered how the Lord would lead the discussion. I was confident he would, because I asked him to. At least today I was confident, but I acknowledge that sometimes it can be hard to trust.

Throughout my career in missions or other work, I've found that if I put my trust in him by asking for what I needed, and believing he would answer, I wouldn't be disappointed in him. It's the times I haven't, when I use my power and strength, that I get myself into trouble.

What made today exciting was how a question I asked, which I believe came from the Spirit, had us each contributing wisdom and advice to each other for an hour. We were reminded again how important it is to have a fellowship of believers we can turn to in times of need, people who seek the Lord and trust him to deliver according to his will.

We can needlessly become anxious and forget, however. 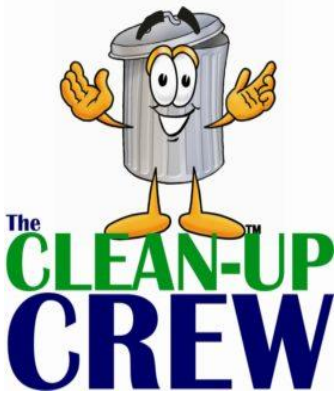

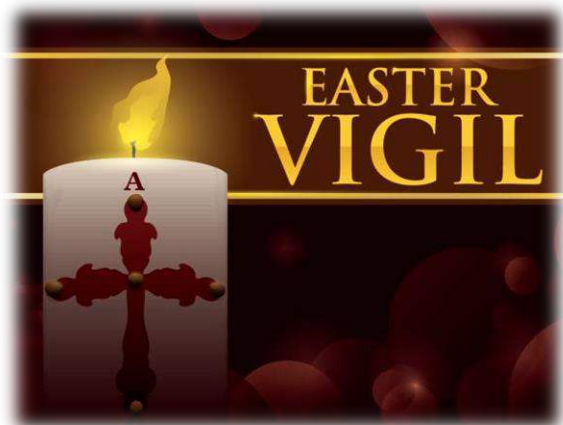

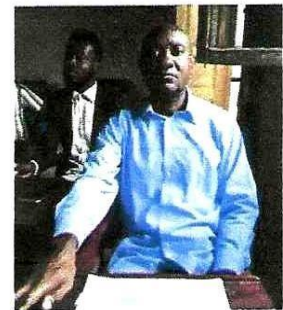

"And [Jesus] called to him his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to heal every disease and every affliction." (Matthew 10:1)

Groups are fascinating. Put ten or twelve people together for dinner and you'll almost always have a wide assortment of characters. If the group is tackling a project, inevitably someone will take charge. The servant-hearted will roll up their sleeves and go to work. The encouragers will cheerlead. The administratively gifted and highly organized types will do their best to keep up, keep track and keep working. This is the nature of groups, and it must have been something like this with the twelve disciples. Jesus assembled a diverse band of trainees, each one wired and gifted in unique ways. Fittingly, for our March meeting, we'll look at "The Final Four" disciples: the obscure James, Thaddaeus, Simon the Zealot, and the most notorious of the twelve - Judas Iscariot.

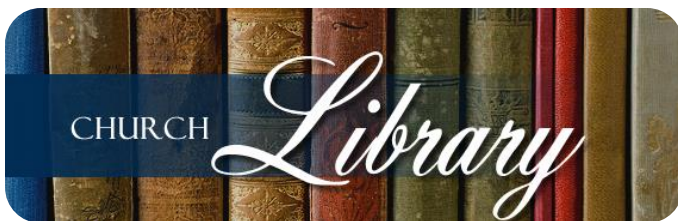

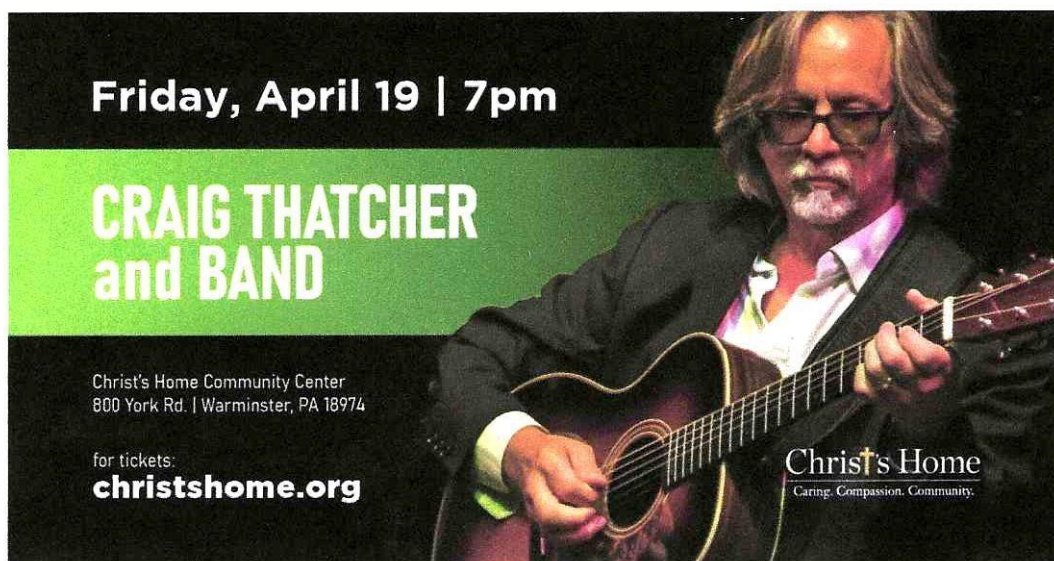
