From the Pastor

Man was ensnared by the assault of the demon, the author of evil, and did not keep the creator's commandment, and was stripped of grace, and was deprived of the access he had to God, and was covered with the roughness of a life of toil, and was clothed with perishability, and was exiled from paradise in accordance with God's just judgment, and was condemned to death and made subject to corruption.

Yet the compassionate giver of being, and the bestower of well-being, did not abandon man, but at first educated him in many ways and called on him to return in groaning and trembling, by the law and the prophets, the deliberate purpose of which was the eradication of sin — which had spread in many ways and had enslaved humanity and heaped up every kind of evil on human life — and the return of humanity to flourishing.

Since it was through sin that death came into the world like a ferocious beast to ravage human life, it was necessary that the humanity to be redeemed should be freed from sin and liberated from the death that results from sin, and moreover that humanity be strengthened and renewed in its nature and guided in deed and taught the way of virtue that leads out from corruption toward eternal life.

Thus humanity is shown the great sea of love that surrounds it, for the creator and Lord himself takes up the struggle for his own creation and becomes its teacher. And, seeing that the adversary ensnares man by the hope of divinity, the divinity himself becomes embedded in the flesh, and reveals at the same time the goodness and wisdom and justice and power of God:

- goodness, because he did not overlook of the weakness of his creature, but had compassion on him when he fell, and extended his helping hand;

- justice, because when man suffered defeat, he did not make another victorious over the tyrant, nor did he snatch man from death by force, but made him whom death had formerly enslaved through sin again victorious, restoring like through like, which was difficult;
- wisdom, because he found the most appropriate solution to the problem, for by the good pleasure of God the Father, the only-begotten Son and Word and God "who is in the bosom of the Father," who is consubstantial with the Father and the Holy Spirit, who is before the ages, who is eternal, who is "in the beginning" and "with God" the Father and "is God," who, "being in the form of God," descends, humbling his sublimity without abasement, condescends to his own servants, and being perfect God he becomes perfect man and accomplishes the newest of all new things, the only "new thing under the sun,"
- by which the infinite power of God becomes apparent. For what is greater than God becoming man? And the Word became flesh from the Holy Spirit and Mary, and the only lover of mankind is called a mediator between God and humanity, conceived in the womb of the virgin not by the will or desire of a man, but from the Holy Spirit. And he becomes obedient to the Father in that flesh which is our own and has been received from us, and heals our disobedience and becomes an example to us of obedience.

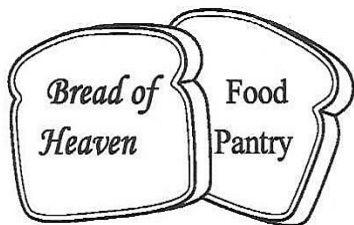

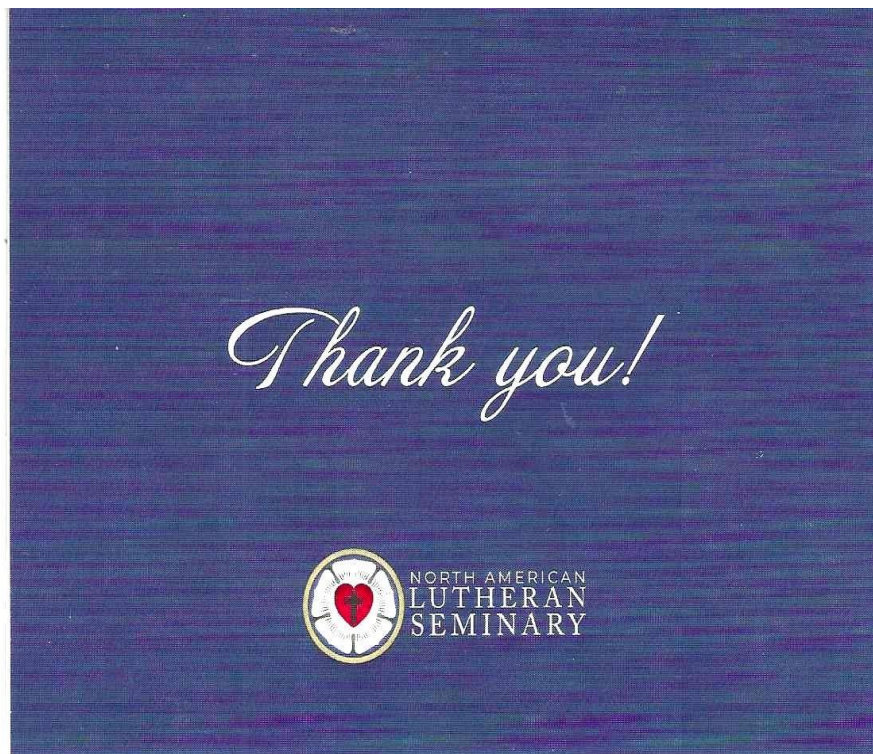

Notes from Council:

We will be giving highlights from our last council meeting each month in Echoes. Once the minutes are approved from the previous month, they will be available in the Narthex.

Council met on Tuesday December 3RD. We opened our meeting as we do every month with devotions.

Bread of Heaven served 139 guest in November giving out 120 turkey breast and 12 turkeys.

Investment Committee They are meeting more regularly to keep on top of changing conditions.

Evangelism Committee They have created a new brochure/card that can be given out with information about Holy Trinity.

Family Ministry 13 Care packages were sent out to college students and 2 were sent to serving military.

Property – They are looking into renovating the bathroom off of the Study to make it handicap accessible. They are also replacing the thresholds needed in the office area.

Stewardship Pledge cards have been collected. They continue to look for ways to have a higher response

New Business –

The council reviewed and approved the proposed budget for 2025. We plan on having a review of this budget during the Sunday School hour a week prior to the Congregational meeting, January 19TH and present to the congregation for approval during the annual meeting

As always if you have any questions, concerns, or ideas, please talk to any of the council members. If you are unsure who we are, our pictures are in the Narthex.

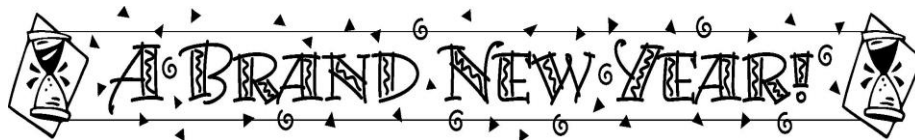

This adoption of Rules of Procedure has always been done at the outset
of every denominational or synodical convocation (LCA, ELCA, or NALC).

This adoption needs only a simple majority and is done to make the meeting run smoothly. Among other things, The Rules of Procedure say that Holy Trinity's Annual Meeting will be governed by Robert's Rules of Order, that all speeches will be limited to three minutes, and that anyone can present a resolution but that this resolution must be presented in writing to the Committee on Reference and Counsel **by 3:00 p.m.** on the Monday immediately prior the Annual Meeting, **Monday, January 20th**. At the time each resolution is presented to the Annual Meeting, Reference and Counsel will advise the Annual Meeting as to whether or not the resolution should be adopted.

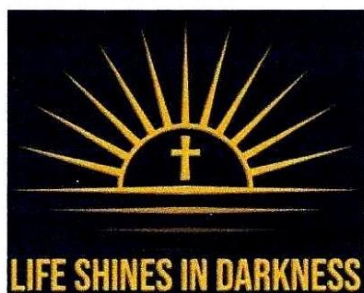

“Life Shines In Darkness” is Lutherans For Life’s theme for Sanctity of Human Life Sunday, which is set for **January 19, 2025**. Life Sunday 2025 theme is based on John 1:4-5: **“In him was life, and the life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.”**

No one can doubt or deny that we dwell in darkness. Sinfulness has broken humankind and left the world wrecked around us. Sanctity of life situations like surprise pregnancy or terminal diagnosis confront us with uncomfortable realities. Serious and genuine threats emerge: pain and labors, poverty and obligations, abandonment and abuse, disgrace and sacrifice. We get pressed against our limitations, failures, and needs. The voice of the devil, the spirit of this age, and the weakness of our flesh tempt and pester us to use death as the solution to the difficulties. Yet the darkness reaches deepest right before the dawn. The hour has come to wake from slumber because the daylight is at hand (Romans 13:11-12).

The incarnate and crucified Son of God, our humble and gentle Lord, our risen and forgiving Savior radiates the light of life in the unlikeliest of places. The Almighty Father creates, redeems, and calls every human life special, precious, and priceless, no matter what age, appearance, or ability, from fertilization to forever.

He delivers blessings of truth and love, joy and hope, community and purpose, grace and faith even in humanity’s shortcomings. To live is Christ, and He alone is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. In Him is life, and this life is the light of all humankind (John 1:3). His power perfects wherever we lack (2 Corinthians 12:9). We get to receive each neighbor as gift and privilege, just like He embraces us, speaking courage, showing compassion, and sharing every good. The people walking in darkness have seen a great light (Isaiah 9:2).

"But Christ, the Man for All Seasons, meets us even here, in the depth of our wintertime. He waits with us. He prunes us.
