From the Pastor,

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

Meditation is a practice commended by scripture:
“This book of the law shall not depart from your mouth,
but you shall meditate on it day and night” (Joshua 1:8).
“Blessed is the man whose delight is in the law of the Lord;
on his law he meditates day and night”
(Psalm 1:1–2).

The church’s tradition of daily prayer calls for meditation:
“The psalms in morning and evening prayer are not so
much hymns of praise as they are the basis for meditation
and devotional reflection upon their meaning. The silence
gives time to do that” (Philip Pfatteicher, *Manual on the
Liturgy*).

Meditation has long been recognized as a core element of
Christian spirituality: “Even if meditation were to mean
nothing but that we are performing a service we owe to
God, this would be reason enough to do it” (Dietrich
Bonhoeffer, *Life Together*).

In a world made artificially frantic by the overwhelming,
never-ceasing press of noise, clamor, and commotion —
and I include the mostly non-auditory but even more
addictive and damaging forces of social media —
meditation is not so much a solution as a bearing of witness
to the truth: *the real world is not like that.*

But Christian and Biblical meditation is not just whatever someone decides to make it. Bonhoeffer insisted that "time for meditation does not allow us to sink into the void and bottomless pit of aloneness." Meditation is not about a removal of the praying self from words and ideas (C. S. Lewis at times seemed to think this, but if he did, he was wrong). Meditation is not a prioritization of the ineffably immaterial at the expense of the communicably intellectual. Meditation is not an instrumental attempt to empty the mind so as to achieve freedom from stress and improvement in mood. Any confusion of Christian meditation with such other forms of "spirituality," whatever they might be called, is a step away from the true God who reveals himself in Jesus Christ.

Christian meditation is meditation on the word of God. Luther, reflecting on Psalm 1, wrote in 1516: "To meditate is to think carefully, deeply, and diligently. Properly speaking, it means to chew over" — he actually used the word from which we get the English *ruminate* — "something in the heart." A bit later, in 1526, he expanded on this: "Meditation consists first in close attention to the words of the law, and then in drawing together various parts of scripture. And this is a pleasant hunt, a game rather like the play of stags in the forest." Christian meditation is chewing on something; it is attention to scripture; it is focusing on God's ways and works rather than ours.

The great 17th-century Lutheran theologian Johann Gerhard wrote, along with many volumes of extremely scholastic and academic theology, a remarkable book entitled *Sacred Meditations*. I used a paragraph from Gerhard for one of our Stations of the Cross this year, and I commend these meditations — or any like them — for our devotion in the season of Easter.

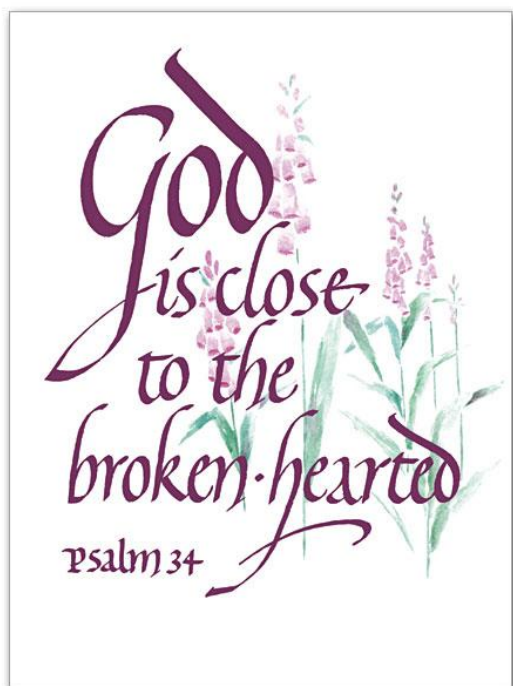

Dear Friends,

This thank-you letter has a wider distribution this month as our Together In Prayer (TIP) newsletter undergoes some changes. I want our supporters who pray for us and those we serve, who give financially, and who serve those with little or no access to the Good News, to know how much we appreciate your ongoing support. I also want to keep our constituency informed about some of the exciting ways God is revealing his glory through our work, and some of the joys & burdens for prayer.

Psalm 66 encourages us to sing the glory of his name. The chapter also takes us through what God has done in history; how he has tested us (Vs10) with crushing burdens (vs11), and how he has brought his people through fire and water to a place of abundance (vs12). The chapter also provides the author's response to God in making offerings to him, who then expresses his desire to in turn, tells what God has done for his soul (vs16), that God wouldn't have listened had there been iniquity in his heart, and declares that God has listened (vs18), and that he is blessed that God has not rejected his prayers or removed his steadfast love (vs20). It's my prayer that as you read this letter, you will also sing praises to God in your own way, acknowledging what he has done and is doing through all of us committed to bringing Jesus, the Way, the Truth, and the Life, to those least reached. Here are some highlights:

The Testing of the Middle East Conflict: We praise the Lord that our workers and those we serve in the Middle East, Central, and South Asia are safe. The war is being felt, with some workers spending nights and parts of days in shelters or limiting their movements due to demonstrations and unrest. Workers are praying with unbelievers who are very fearful as rockets hit parts of the Middle East that have been perceived as very safe. Please continue to pray for the safety of our workers in these regions, and that the peace of Christ will be made known to those who have yet to find it.

Charles Jackson, Executive Director of WMPL Canada, is being flown from Cambodia to Canada as I write this. A week ago, I had the opportunity to have an extended talk with Charles from his hospital bed as he recovered from a severe brain injury. I had tears in my eyes at several points in our forty-five-minute conversation as he related to me his progress, and his ongoing struggles with speaking. I was impressed with his progress and was singing God's praises for answered prayers!

Our Personnel Team, led by Chris Adamow (Finance and Personnel Director) and supported by Kari Hilpert (Personnel Coordinator), is struggling to keep pace with the rising numbers of inquirers and candidates. On the one hand, it's a good problem to have, but on another, it is almost a 'crushing burden' for Chris and Kari to manage. Kari's daughter is undergoing treatment for cancer and she needs to spend time with her daughter. We are looking for a person who senses a call to serve as Personnel Director so Chris can focus on other areas of need (Finance/Administration). Please pray!

Thank you again for the generosity shown through your prayers, giving, and going!

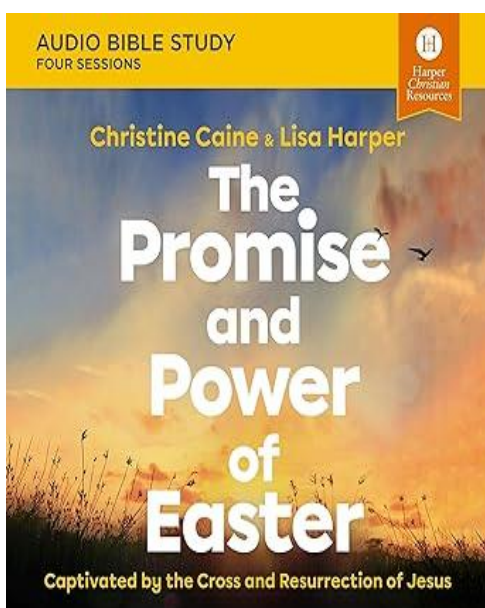
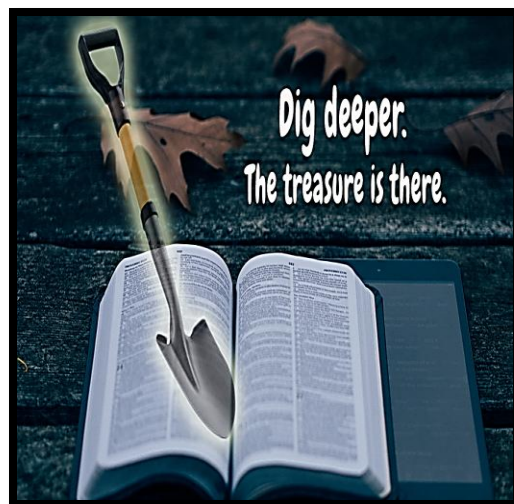

BOOKS & BOWLS: LENTEN SUPPORT FOR DIDI'S ORPHANS



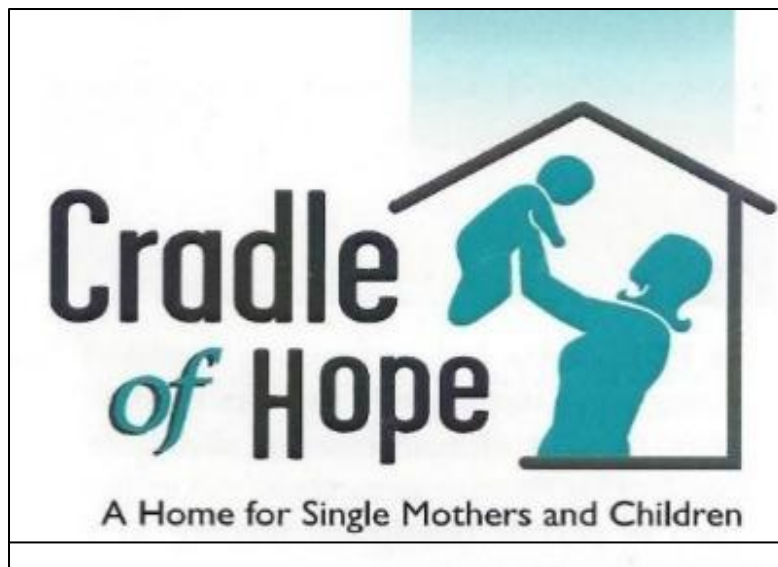
Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving are what we are called to focus on during this solemn season of Lent. Your Social Ministry committee would like to give you an opportunity for giving alms to benefit orphans in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC).

In our February Echoes, you read that Holy Trinity's members and missionaries, Didi and Serafina Panzo, returned to the DRC in December. Didi has told us that during this four-year commitment, he and Serafina would like to focus on the orphans and the women. Our church women (LCW) will consider the focus on the women. We ask you, the congregation, to focus on the orphans.

Didi has told us that these precious children are fed only once a day at the orphanage. During Didi and Serafina's first years of service in the DRC, these children came knocking on their door to ask for food. We sent plates, bowls, and utensils to equip the Panzos to provide meals. Didi and Serafina now have the children come for a meal and a time of presenting Bible stories. As for the children's schooling, someone must pay the tuition so that they can attend.

To that end, meet our Lenten project, **Books & Bowls**. Please consider a contribution to raise funds to provide both meals and tuition for the orphans served by Didi and Serafina. You can check out the thermometer in the narthex to see how our collection progresses through Lent.

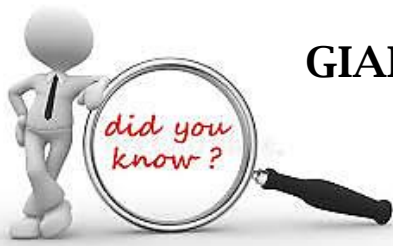

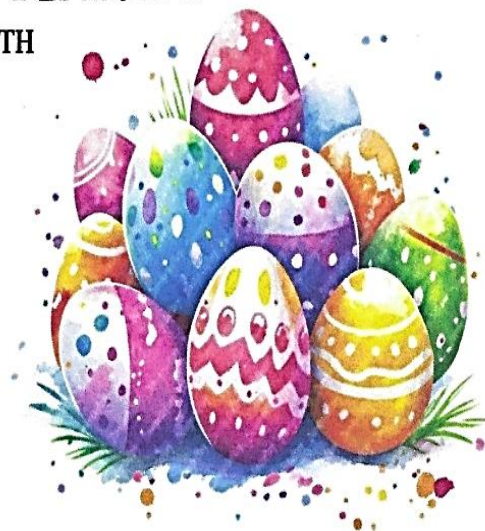

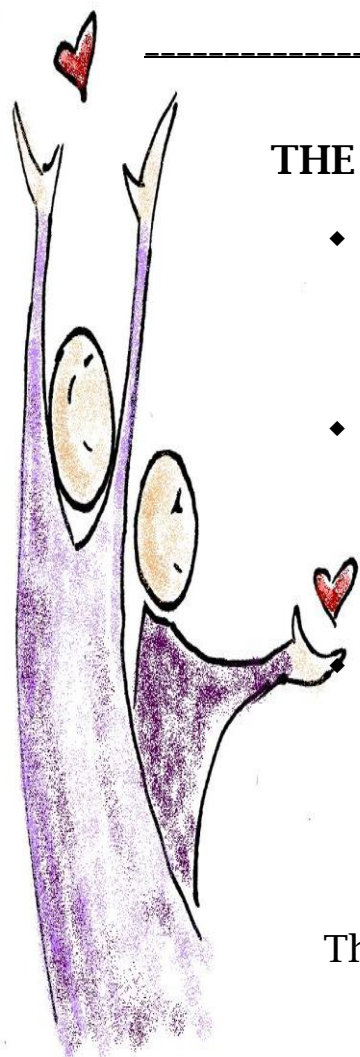


THE BLESSED SARNELLI COMMUNITY NEEDS YOU

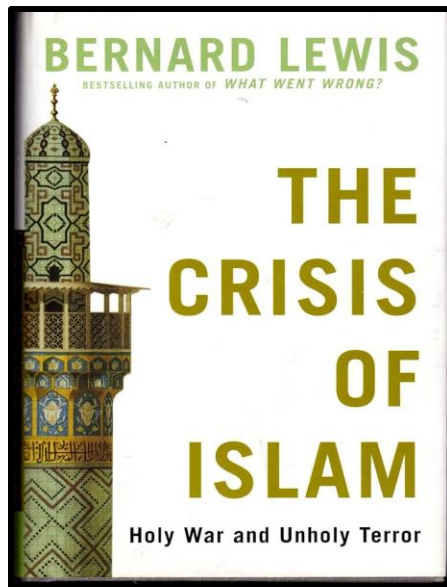
